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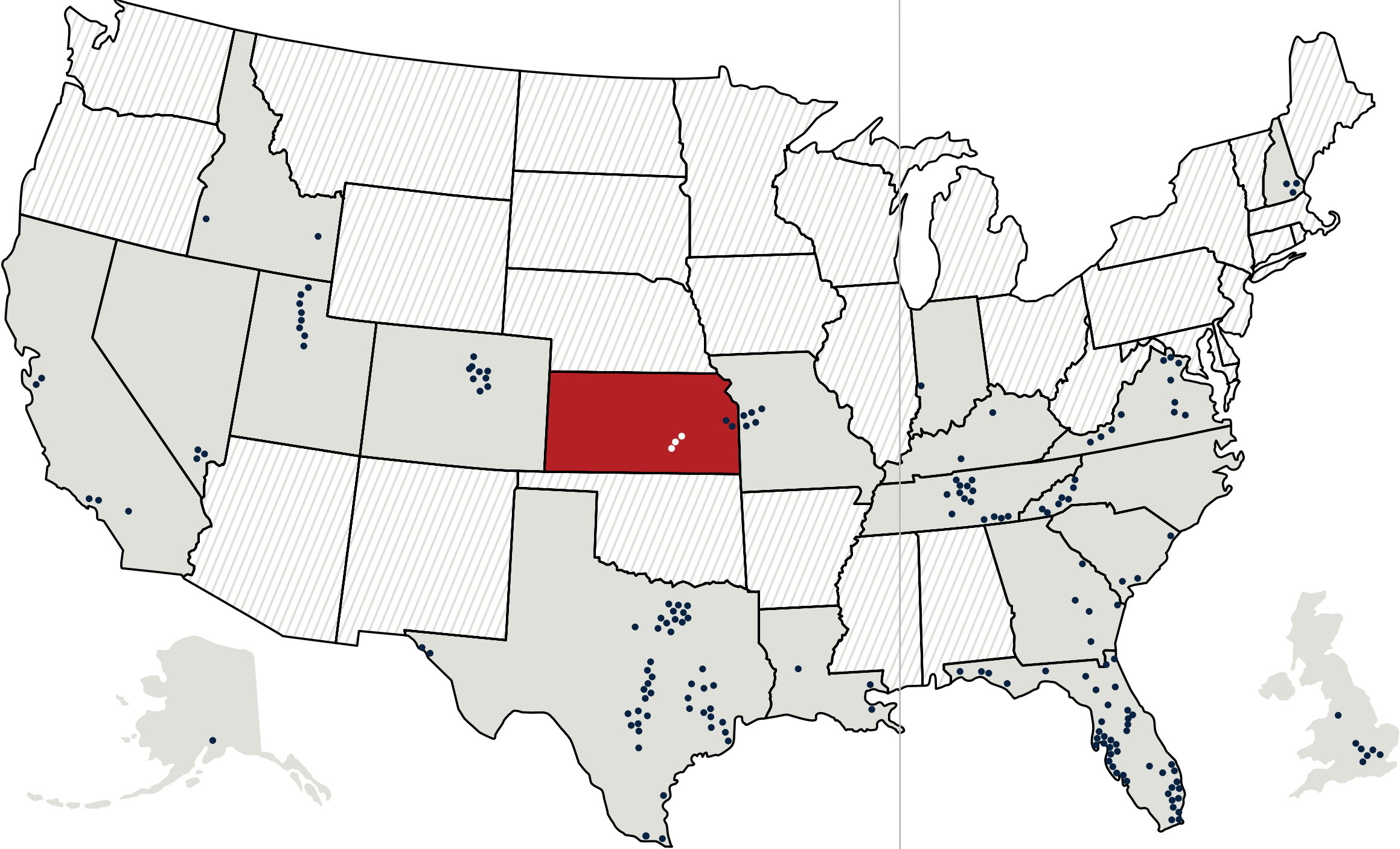

Our facilities provide a family-centered healing environment to ensure pediatric patients and their families feel comfortable.

Physician Services Group

Wesley Healthcare's Physician Services Group (PSG) provides high-quality healthcare in an expansive, multispecialty network of clinics throughout Wichita. All members of our team share a commitment to high-quality medicine, good citizenship and, above all, patient-focused medical care. Our physicians also help provide care to patients in rural Kansas communities, as well as Colorado, Oklahoma, Nebraska and Missouri.

Sarah Cannon Cancer Institute at Wesley Healthcare

Offering integrated cancer services with convenient access to cutting-edge therapies for patients, Sarah Cannon, the Cancer Institute of HCA Healthcare, is a global network with programs across the United States and in the United Kingdom. Programs include individualized patient navigation provided by oncology-trained nurses, a leading blood cancer network, hundreds of clinical trial options - and molecular profiling capabilities. Providing interdisciplinary treatment planning through local and international tumor boards leverages expertise across Sarah Cannon's network of physicians and ensures a team approach to patient care. Through its services, Sarah Cannon is providing state-of-the-art cancer care, from diagnosis to survivorship, close to home for our patients.

Surgicare of Wichita

Surgicare of Wichita provides same-day surgical services for residents of Wichita and surrounding communities throughout South Central Kansas. Surgicare performs minimally invasive procedures in the areas of ear, nose and throat, orthopaedics, gastroenterology, general surgery, gynecology, ophthalmology, podiatry, pain management, plastic surgery, urology and dental procedures.

Wesley Healthcare Rural Network

Wesley Healthcare's Rural Network provides the highest level of quality specialty care to patients and is committed to helping patients stay close to home for their healthcare.

In 2022, we completed more than 1,500 clinic days in rural communities and provided over 4,700 telehealth consultations to rural hospitals, helping patients access our award-winning health care, close to home. We also cared for over 30,000 patients from communities outside of Wichita.

With Wesley Healthcare's stroke treatment programs, we have developed one of the most successful virtual tele-stroke networks as part of the Rural Network. In 2022, we helped our rural partners retain more than 70 percent of patients who received a tele-stroke consultation, providing patients access to highly specialized care quickly, without having to leave their immediate communities.

From cardiology and neurology to OB/GYN and pediatrics, our specialists go the distance for our patients. Through our Rural Network, more than 100 healthcare specialists travel via air or ground on a regular basis to provide services to rural communities caring for more rural patients than any other health system in Wichita.

Beyond the specialty clinics, the Wesley Healthcare Rural Network includes continuing medical education, clinical preceptorships available at each Wesley facility, purchasing programs for used medical equipment, and facilitation of recruitment through one of two primary care residency programs.

Responding to crisis and community needs

Crush the Crisis

In 2022, all 15 HCA Healthcare U.S. divisions participated in the 4th annual “Crush the Crisis” opioid take back day at 110 collection sites across 17 states.

In partnership with law enforcement officers from local police departments, Wesley Healthcare collected 265 pounds of unused and expired medications during the national opioid take back day. The event aligns with the Drug Enforcement Administration’s (DEA) National Prescription Drug Take Back Day, an annual event that raises awareness about the danger of opioid misuse and the importance of safe and proper disposal of medications.

Healthy Food for Healthier Tomorrows Food and Nutrition Drive

Wesley Healthcare participated in HCA Healthcare’s Healthy Food for Healthier Tomorrows Food and Nutrition Drive in November and the results were amazing! Wesley collected 440 pounds of food that went to local food banks supporting the community.

In 2022, HCA Healthcare colleagues provided more than 345,000 nutritious meals and the HCA Healthcare Foundation provided \$175,000 in funds to support the related nonprofit organizations.

HCA Healthcare Foundation

In 2022, the HCA Healthcare Foundation continued to support the Healthier Tomorrow Fund, a community impact fund focused on addressing high-priority community needs and advancing health equity. Since its launch in 2021, the Fund has invested more than \$18.3 million in 16 communities where HCA Healthcare has a presence, and granted awards to 51 nonprofit partners including the American Heart Association, Jobs for America’s Graduates (JAG) and the United Way.

In late 2022, Wesley Healthcare began conversations with Wichita State University to make its Suspenders4Hope available to colleagues. This program is a comprehensive, strategic approach to promoting mental health wellness, preventing suicide, substance abuse and sexual violence. All of Wesley Healthcare’s 4,000+ colleagues will receive the training in 2023.

Wesley Healthcare also committed to partnering with other organizations that support this work. We’re focused on creative solutions to support the needs of all members of our community, with an emphasis on underrepresented populations.

Caring for the community

School partnerships and career pipeline development

Wesley Healthcare has a number of school partnerships aimed at healthcare career exposure and engagement. Notable are partnerships with Andover Public Schools, Derby Public Schools, Goddard Public Schools, Maize Public Schools, Wichita Public Schools, Wichita State University and WSU Tech.

The partnerships take a myriad of forms and engage thousands of students in activities such as career fairs and speaker events at schools. Smaller groups of students engage in on-site activities at hospitals including, tours, volunteerism, internships and observation days.

Wesley Healthcare is excited about the opportunity to expose students to a number of careers in the growing healthcare industry.

Supporting our community

- Wesley Healthcare worked with the American Red Cross to host several community blood drives during the national blood crisis.
- In partnership with Wichita Public Schools and WSU Tech, we're creating a Healthcare Future Ready Center to better train future healthcare workers.
- Wesley's Trauma Outreach team is working with local and national organizations to address critical community needs including Stop the Bleed, Hold My Guns and fentanyl abuse.
- Representatives from the Sarah Cannon Cancer Institute at Wesley Healthcare attended a health fair at Wichita State University to educate students on the importance of cancer screening.
- Wesley Women's Hospital colleagues regularly attend community baby fairs to educate expectant moms on steps toward a healthy pregnancy and delivery.

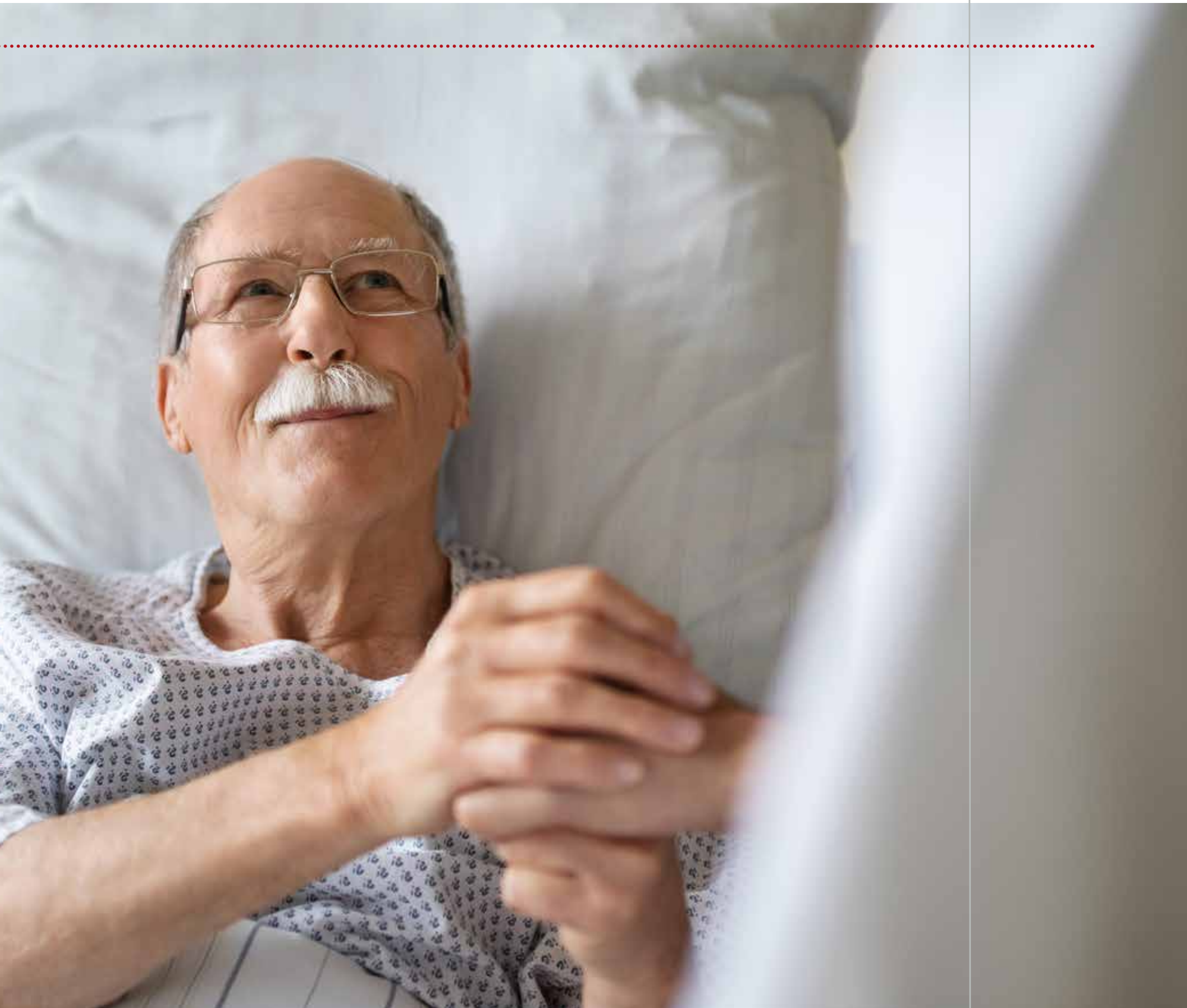
